

3rd ROUND INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT: MARK CALCAVECCHIA
Saturday, May 17, 2014



MARK CALCAVECCHIA: I didn't play bad. I didn't make any putts. I only made one putt on 17. Two wrong clubs and a chunked wedge in the water on 11. That's two bogeys and a double and no putts line up to 74. Actually hung in there pretty good for that. Unfortunately my ribs are feeling worse. I don't know. I'll get through tomorrow, but I don't know what the future holds after that. It's not good.

Q. Five or six guys are going to be 4-under going into the final round. It should make for some great golf.

MARK CALCAVECCHIA: A lot of guys have a chance to win this tournament. Kenny's playing really good. The way he's driving it, he's got such an advantage. He hits it about 30 yards farther than the rest of us. That's a big advantage. He's clearly the favorite. He's got the lead. He'll be hard to catch but it definitely can be done. John Inman had a 66 today. If the weather's good, there's a 66 out there, believe me. It's gettable. Anybody 3-, 4-under shoots 66, or 5-under, whatever, 9- or 10-under will probably win this thing.

Q. With your ribs bothering you, would you stay around?

MARK CALCAVECCHIA: Yeah, I'd stick it out. Yeah, I'll definitely -- I'm playing okay. If I was 40th or 50 I would probably still stick it out. I was hurt here last year and stuck it out. I'm used to it, unfortunately. It sucks. I was feeling pretty good coming in here and it kind of came out of nowhere. You know, just a part of being old and out of shape, I guess.

Q. They were hurting all day today, weren't they?

MARK CALCAVECCHIA: Yes, all day, from the second hole on.
