

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT: JACK NICKLAUS & GARY PLAYER
Saturday, June 7, 2014



Q. Just a comment quick from both you and Gary. Five-under in the best ball and you'll be three back going into tomorrow but you have the low score over here today in the Legends Division. Just talk about how you guys played.

JACK NICKLAUS: Well, I'd say Gary played very well. I was all right the front nine. It was all Gary the back nine, thank goodness, because I wasn't very good. I'll have to say that Gary made some putts when he needed to make some putts and I couldn't make the putts when I needed to make the putts. But we ham and egged it reasonably well throughout the round.

GARY PLAYER: I think Jack summed it up well, we ham and egged it very well and that's the important thing. Really a nice format, we had a lot of fun. We had a large gallery walking around with us, enjoyed it very much. The course was in great shape and we're really looking forward to tomorrow because three shots as we always know is not very much. We keep hearing, it's fascinating in tournament golf, a guy's six shots in and he thinks he's going to win. So it's always open and we look forward to tomorrow and we're going to make a big charge tomorrow.

Q. Were there any highlights, anybody make a long putt?

JACK NICKLAUS: I had two short birdie putts on the back nine and I looked at Gary -- they were both inside six feet -- and I said to Gary, Gary, I don't really want to putt these. He had two 30-footers and holed them both.

Q. So that was the highlight of the day?

JACK NICKLAUS: They were my highlights because I didn't have to putt the five footers.

GARY PLAYER: The highlight of the day was the shot he hit at No. 9. The wind was really whipping and he took a 4-iron, and how it never went in the hole, that far from the hole.

JACK NICKLAUS: It carried in the hole and popped out.

Q. 4-iron?

JACK NICKLAUS: Yeah, 148 yards.

Q. That's how hard it was blowing.

JACK NICKLAUS: Oh, yeah.
