

**FINAL ROUND INTERVIEW TRANSCRIPT:  
JAY HAAS & PETER JACOBSEN  
Sunday, June 8, 2014**



**JAY HAAS:** Just a very makeable putt at No. 17 and just pulled it a little bit.

**Q. That was the one I was going to talk to you about on 17 because if you made that, then you're at 20. Just your thoughts?**

**JAY HAAS:** I'm disappointed because I hit a beautiful iron in there and it was as easy a putt as you can get straight up the hill and I just pulled it a little bit. We're mixed emotions I think right now. We're very happy to have finished second, but we had an opportunity. Just don't get that many, so it's nice to take advantage of them when you do.

**Q. Peter, I was talking to him, you guys were like prize fighters exchanging punches. You were making birdies but you just could never get to them. Is there a frustration there or what?**

**PETER JACOBSEN:** Well, more than that, an appreciation for the way that Jeff and Fred played. It seemed like they kept hitting it three feet. The first five or six holes they hit it three feet and made birdie. And then when Slu made the long putt on 7 or I should say 16, that was just a clutch putt. You're not going to get more clutch than these two guys.

We hung in there. It's just a pleasure to play with my partner. It's just a pleasure to play with Jay and watch him play. He's one of the best players we've ever seen in the history of the Champions Tour, so for me to be there with him felt good.

**Q. Hey, guys, did you feel a little nervous again? You mentioned yesterday you felt nervous at the start.**

**PETER JACOBSEN:** Today I wasn't nervous, I probably should have been nervous. It's so hard in alternate shot, you don't know when to be aggressive and when not to be aggressive. You hit a bad shot and then you don't make your par, you don't save your par and then that kind of compounds it, so you get frustrated. But I think we did a good job of not getting frustrated. We stayed up, we made a couple bogeys early, we came back with a couple of birdies. We made a bad bogey on 8, unfortunate bogey on 8 in the morning. But hey, we hung in there. I'm proud of Jay, I'm proud of the way I played.

**Q. You gave the fans a treat, it came right down to the wire obviously with that putt being made on the last. But you had a little funny comment. Can you just talk about that on the last hole?**

**PETER JACOBSEN:** Well, I had the same putt Fred did and it was an extremely difficult putt and I was glad Fred was putting first. He was going to show me the line and then he didn't get it up on the plateau and it ended up over there almost off the green to the right. Jay said, hey, knock it in.

**JAY HAAS:** Looks like an easy tough putt to make.

**PETER JACOBSEN:** I said, well, Fred showed me the line.
