

FINAL ROUND INTERVIEW: JEFF SLUMAN
Sunday, April 26, 2015



Q. Just a couple thoughts, you and Tom played pretty good but not quite good enough this week. You've had a good run in this. Just talk about the week here.

JEFF SLUMAN: You know, first and foremost, what a great week for golf in this state of Missouri. Johnny Morris, what he's done up here with the Top of the Rock. Fabulous venue, fun format, a format that we rarely see, let alone a partnership with friends, now on a par 3, best ball, modified -- I don't know what you call it.

Q. Alternate shot.

JEFF SLUMAN: Alternate shot. It was a great week. Tom and I actually played very well. Some years, like the last couple for me, I've been fortunate enough to make enough putts with the partnership and this year we didn't make enough. So we finished, what, 14-under, so looks like we're three or four back. But we had a great run of playing this and I'm anxious to come back next year and see if we can do a little better.

Q. If you had to look back on the week, was there one day in particular that set you behind the eight ball do you think?

JEFF SLUMAN: Really the first day over at the big course, Buffalo Ridge, we really played well and shot 5-under. You know, I mean everybody says we left a few out there, but we really could have shot easy 9- to 10-under. We putted the ball very well, they just didn't go in, we hit the edges. That's just the way golf is. The weeks you win, those putts go in. The weeks you don't, kind of shake your head, pull your hair and then wonder how they didn't go in. That kind of got us behind the eight ball. I thought we played very well in the wind yesterday at the Top of the Rock. I believe somebody said we had the lowest round. So we did all the right things, but the week ended and we didn't make quite enough putts.
