

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW: LEE JANZEN
Friday, June 12, 2015



Q. 2-under today. Lots of low scores but 6-under, you're still right there.

LEE JANZEN: Saw a lot of good scores out there. I doubled a par 5 that's reachable in two, so you could say that's three shots right there and that turns a 2-under to a 5-under, which would have been a really good score. I'm still in search of that one day where I grind, I'll never make a mistakes.

Q. Like Steve today.

LEE JANZEN: Steve, 63, that's pretty good.

Q. Yeah, he said he didn't make a mistake.

LEE JANZEN: That's good, really good playing.

Q. Course play any differently at all?

LEE JANZEN: Less wind today made it a little bit more manageable for sure. It's hard to get it in the fairway, you just have to shape your shots and hit the right club off the tee so you want to have a shot out of the fairway to have a chance to get it close. For me I've done a really good job of judging out of rough for two days, just I pushed it on 16 today and that resulted in a bogey, but I've been really good at judging it out of the rough for two days.

Q. Lee, this is a four-round event so it's more like a PGA TOUR event where you've got two more days. When you have a day like today, any thoughts on that with the weekend? I mean 63's obviously out there if the conditions are right.

LEE JANZEN: I'm certainly used to playing four rounds still. This is only my first full year on the Champions Tour. And then last couple tournaments we played were four-rounders, so I don't think it would be that big of a challenge. Hopefully it has something to do with it. If there is an advantage to be had, it would go to the guys that are younger and been playing four rounds more regularly. But golf never really seems to work out that way.
