ROUND 1 INTERVIEW: MARK WILSON

Q. Just kind of talk about the round and the conditions this morning.

MARK WILSON: Yeah, it's nice to get out there early with no wind for a few holes. Just rolled in some putts. That's been the difference I guess than other starts this season so far. Made a couple 20-footers on the first nine that got me going in the right direction.

Q. I noticed the wind's kind of starting to pick up a little. How much does this course change things when the wind does pick up?

MARK WILSON: Yeah, it makes a big deal because it is all about keeping it between the mangroves. Just keep it in play and you're okay. But then when the crosswinds come, it makes it a lot more difficult to do that. As long as you drive it straight here and you've got a shot from even the rough, it's not that tough of a course, you've just got to get it in play.

Q. It seems like yesterday you won here, obviously still like this course a lot and it seems to fit your eye?

MARK WILSON: Yeah, it sure does, because that's my game. The pin is straight, I don't hit that far and this course isn't about that, it's more about hitting it straight. It is, I enjoy it. Almost every hole grabs your attention. You can't fall asleep on too many holes out there, otherwise you might be dropping.

Q. What was the highlight of your round, was there a shot that stood out?

MARK WILSON: Made a good par save on 15. Hit a poor chip there, had about maybe an 18-footer for par and knocked that in and that was good. We're always greedy. I would have loved to have gotten a couple more coming in. Just pulled my second shot here and made a bogey on the last hole, but I'm going to try to focus on all the putts that did go in and all the good shots that went at the hole.

Q. You pulled your drive on this one?

MARK WILSON: No, my second shot from the fairway, pulled it and hit a poor chip. But no, I'm going to try to focus on the putts that went in and all those good shots I hit.
