

ROUND 1 INTERVIEW: JIMMY WALKER
December 3, 2015



Q. Can you just talk about the finish? Did you practice on this course, did you think you could finish like that?

JIMMY WALKER: Oh, I don't know if you think about that, you just go play. Whatever happens, happens. You can do that anywhere at any time. You just have to let it happen. I don't know. I mean you see guys shoot really good scores in tough tournaments, tough courses. U.S. Opens they get into a groove. It's just a matter of getting out of your own way when it kind of starts happening.

Q. (Inaudible.) Got it going because I know even par ...

JIMMY WALKER: I didn't really have hardly any expectations coming in. I haven't been doing a whole lot at home. I just started four or five days ago working on getting back into golf shape and working on some new swing stuff with my coach. I didn't know what to expect this week because I have to implement it on the golf course and it's tough. I hit a lot of really good shots yesterday and a lot of bad ones. It was tough yesterday, the pro-am round was very long and it was hard to get into a little bit of a groove and a lot of waiting, and I felt today we had a nice rhythm and I was able to kind of keep the good feeling going.

Q. What are the things you're working on?

JIMMY WALKER: It's the head move. You know, you have to really enjoy watching golf swings to probably see it. I know my swing and what I do to see it but it's tough, it's very different.

Q. I was watching you. Is that like Butch talking about that or is that you? How did you come up with that, that move?

JIMMY WALKER: Something he's been trying to get me to do for a while and it's tough and I've really just tried to, I told him I was going to make a really tough commitment to try to do it and it's tough. I mean, I've been swinging a certain way for a long time and it's a hard habit to break.

Q. That kind of atmosphere out there, does that make it easier where it doesn't feel so much like a regular tournament?

JIMMY WALKER: Yeah, you're making birdies and there's not many people out there watching. I'm sure they're following Jordan around and a couple other guys. I heard it was a limited number of people they're letting in so it feels pretty small, but on a grand scale it's a big event with really good players.
