

Q. You're standing at even par throughout a couple rounds, tough scoring conditions out there. Talk about how you navigated the course.

BART BRYANT: I just tried to be patient, tried to leave it below the hole all day. That's key out here. You get past the hole, it's trouble. I did that once today, had no shot. But just kind of keep the ball in front of you, hopefully keep it out of some of these fairway bunkers or some of these lips you can get under if you're not careful. So I've avoided that for two days and when I've hit it in the rough I've had places where I can play the green from and like I've said, I've just kept it pretty much below the hole, which is good. I think I had four birdies and four bogeys, so it's pretty solid. You're not going to make a lot of birdies on this course I don't think unless the wind dies down or they soften up the course or put some different pins, so it's going to be tough scoring out here I think.

Q. Is the wind condition, is it drying out the greens a little bit, speeding up?

BART BRYANT: A little, not bad. I thought they were a little firmer yesterday afternoon. Of course I played late so by the time later this afternoon they may firm up again, but I didn't think they were that firm today to be honest with you.

Q. You're sitting good pretty good standing here through a couple rounds. Do you like your chances heading into the weekend?

BART BRYANT: Yeah, yeah. Even par these first two days with the wind the way it was I think is a good solid start. I'm guessing I'll be within three or four of the lead more than likely unless somebody, Bernhard or somebody goes off. So anytime you're right there within three or four a couple days of play, you're in the golf tournament.
