

Q. So just briefly talk about the conditions today, all the other days. Did you feel like you maybe got used to it a little bit after being out here for three days?

BRANDT JOBE: I think you do. Because it was the same wind we've had the first two days, at least (inaudible,) but today it was times -- it was swirling so hard. I mean, from 105 yards we played a 150-yard shot, so how do you gauge that? But the golf course is playable. We had to have gusts over 40 today, it was brutal, but I think today was the toughest day because it was hard to putt. You got on exposed holes like 10 and 4, 14, it was just hard to putt. But yeah, tough day. I mean, I thought if I got it to even par I had a good shot of winning the golf tournament. I got there, I just couldn't stay there.

Q. What positives do you take away from this week knowing that this course played so difficult with the conditions on already such a tough track that you were right there in the mix?

BRANDT JOBE: You know what, my game's -- I've had a long time off, I had a couple shoulder surgeries so I probably didn't play for like two years. So this is my eighth, ninth, 10th tournament of the year, the PGA, I've had a good stretch here so I'm looking at it as positives. It's good. I know I can play and I know I belong out here, so it's good. And now it's working harder and fixing a few -- I've still got some problems and some glitches to work out, but it's good so I'm looking forward to it.
