

Q. How much different was it out there today with a a little more wind blowing?

GENE SAUERS: It was really difficult. The club selection was tough and the greens seemed to be a little bit slower today, I couldn't ever get them to the daggone hole. But still it's a great golf course, had a good time, played with two good guys, and I'm still right there so I'm okay. I put a lot of pressure on probably all parts of my game today, driving, all irons, like I say I wasn't making the putts, leaving them all short, leaving myself three, four, five footers for par. So hopefully things will be a little different tomorrow, I can relax and calm down and get into the zone again like I was the first day.

Q. Did you feel good about the way you were handling your position and just trying to take what the course had to offer?

GENE SAUERS: Yeah, I was. You know, I have a tendency to be hard on myself and the pressure sometimes gets to you and stuff, so I just trying to get, like I said yesterday, take a bunch of deep breathes and take one shot at a time and do the best I can. It was tough out there. Like I said, the putting, kept leaving myself those long par putts. It will wear on you.

Q. Everyone says it's hard to follow one low round with another one. Was this Exhibit A today?

GENE SAUERS: Sure, it's tough, I shot 69 still so I'm glad to still shoot under par, still right there in the thick of things. Hopefully I can just relax tomorrow and go slow and easy.

Q. What do you think about heading in tomorrow?

GENE SAUERS: What do I think about heading in tomorrow?

Q. Yeah.

GENE SAUERS: I'm right where I want to be. I don't like to be top, people chasing me. I like to be chasing them. So I'm right where I want to be and looking forward to tomorrow.

Q. Do you have a concept of what it would take, what the winning score might be tomorrow? Do you put that number in your head?

GENE SAUERS: I try not to, but just guessing off the top of my head it might be, if the wind blows, I think a storm is coming in, I'm just saying somewhere around 17-ish maybe, who knows.

Q. How much harder was it with the wind today?

GENE SAUERS: It was tough with the wind today. Club selection was tough and you had to keep the ball down. If you didn't keep it down, winds will take it and throw it way over in the bunker, so it was tough today.

Q. If these greens get moisture overnight, how low could the scores go tomorrow?

GENE SAUERS: It could go low. Like I say, you could probably throw it right at it, you know. A lot of times I day we had to plan short and try to bounce it up, but if they get a lot of moisture we'll just throw it right at it, but then again the greens might be slow too so you just never know.
