

Q. 15 is the one everybody will be asking about. What went through the club selection there, and it's been a hole (inaudible)?

BART BRYANT: Yeah, I hit it way right one day. It was either the first round or the pro-am or something, I hit way right of are where I thought I was going to hit it and I ended up perfect. And so, you know, when I stood up there I kind of I knew the wind was left to right and I hit some low left drive this week and I said the last thing you can do is hit it in those left bunkers, where the pin was on the left side is just too tough of a shot. I said if anything, miss it right, you know. I didn't know I was going to miss it a hundred yards or anything. I was just telling him, my driver is -- that's my bread and butter, that's how I've played a living playing the tour. And it kind of let me down this week. I didn't drive the ball very well this week. I got it in play okay today other than the one, but I hit very few solid drives and it probably cost me about six shots this week, which is very unusual for me. Luckily I putted the eyes off of it. If it wasn't for that -- if I had a normal putting week, I probably would have finished about 50th. Luckily I just had a great putting week. My ball striking was probably below average.

Q. But you were really in that position even in the back nine?

BART BRYANT: I was, yeah.

Q. I mean, perfect -- at that point was it where you thought you would be, were you impressed with your nerves to that point?

BART BRYANT: Honestly I didn't feel too nervy all day, even on that tee shot. You know, I wish I knew exactly why I hit that shot. If I did, I wouldn't have done it. If anybody knows, send me an email, let me know why I did it. You know, obviously if I had to do it over I probably should have -- I had 17-under, I figured I was probably one shot in the lead or tied for the lead, I thought 18 would probably win it. And I had the par 5 coming up. I should have got it in position to hit a wedge in there, you know, I shouldn't have pressed issue on that hole. I probably pressed issue on the next hole. But I drove it so poorly on that par 5 every day, I kept hitting that big tree. I knew I was going to have to go left, which was going to make the hole play tougher for me. And to some degree I felt like this was going to be my birdie opportunity and it's just bad thinking, bad strategy, bad execution, and a three-putt, just bad everything.

Q. Given all the other things going on in your life, are you able to find (inaudible) on the golf course?

BART BRYANT: It's okay. This won't -- I won't even be thinking about this later. I mean, sounds weird because normally this would be very tough for me to swallow. Right now it's

just not that big a deal. You know what, I messed up and second place finish isn't the end of the world, tied for second. But I'm going to go back and be with Cathy tomorrow and that's the important thing and we're going to put keep putting one foot in front of the other. And I have a lot more things to think about than to worry about this. I'll get in this position this year and hopefully I'll handle it better this time.

Q. What did she say when you got in this position last night?

BART BRYANT: She said I want to fly out, but I can't. You know, she's been with me -- of course I've only won four times, three times on the tour and once out here, and of course she's been with me every time. And so maybe I needed her here today, I don't know. Wish she was here.

Q. What's your schedule like coming up?

BART BRYANT: It's going to be up in the air, I'm thinking about, you know, if she's feeling pretty good I might go play Dick's. After that I'll probably shut it down until the end of her chemo and radiation treatment, but I may go out one more week. However, if I get home this week and she's not feeling that good, back to Houston, not feeling good I may just stay with her, I don't know. I kind of have to wait and see. So far she's feeling really well, she's in great spirits. She has more joy in her heart than I do in mine, I guarantee you. She's handling it way better than I am and she's an amazing lady, I tell you, she's really doing well.
