ROUND 2 INTERVIEW: WES SHORT, JR.

## Q. So a nice round there. Just kind of what went well on today's Round 2?

**WES SHORT JR.:** Well, I played the par 5s pretty well. Got off to a good start, birdied the 3rd hole and the 5th hole and I eagled 8 and I birdied 10 and 11. I had a good round going and I three-putted 12 and seemed like nothing really went right after that, but still shot 6 under so that's pretty good.

## Q. Is there anything that's changed on the course from yesterday?

**WES SHORT JR.:** I think it was -- I played better today but I thought it was a little harder yesterday. A lot more humid yesterday. The ball was going a long ways, it was kind of hard to control what your distance was.

## Q. How's it feel to be in the hunt up front heading into the final round tomorrow?

**WES SHORT JR.:** Anytime you can be close going in the last nine holes, that's what you really want to have a chance to win it. I think I played well enough today to get close anyway.

## Q. Seemed like your putter was really working out pretty well for you out there?

**WES SHORT JR.:** Yeah, I putted good. Been struggling a little bit this year with that but putted pretty good until the three-putt and then, you know, I'll get it tomorrow.

Q. Everybody always wants to be in that final group but is there any pressure that comes along with being in a that final group?

**WES SHORT JR.:** It seems like there's a little bit more generally, but if you're planning on winning, good to be in that last group a lot of times.

Q. Seems like more often than not the last few years the winner comes from that second-to-last group. Is that something you have to watch out for since people are shooting all these low numbers?

**WES SHORT JR.:** Yeah, they can sneak up on you sometimes. Seems like, exactly, seems like even on Tour the group in front of you is the one that always sneaks up on you.
