



**Q. Michael, just first-time pro event, how was it first round?**

**MICHAEL JOHNSON:** It was good. I couldn't ask for a better way to start my career. It was awesome. Played with two great guys, which helps, and it was a great day, weather was good. I thought we were going to get rained on a little bit but everything went great.

**Q. Looking up there at the leaderboard and seeing names up like Cabrera and guys that have won big tournaments, and your name's on that list, too, among those in kind of that top tier right now after that first round, just what does that mean for you?**

**MICHAEL JOHNSON:** It was pretty cool to see. Before I teed off I saw Angel put together a pretty good round so that was just cool to see his name. I wasn't really looking at the leaderboard, I was just trying to shoot in the 60s really and just get myself in a good position for tomorrow.

**Q. Kind of like home course advantage a little bit for you?**

**MICHAEL JOHNSON:** Yeah, for me, but these guys do it every week. It's not like they can't prepare for a golf course they haven't seen before.

**Q. Did nerves play any factor?**

**MICHAEL JOHNSON:** Not really. I just wanted to get off the first hole with a par or better and I made an easy 4, so after that I was good to go.

**Q. How do you keep the momentum going the next few days?**

**MICHAEL JOHNSON:** It's pretty easy, I tee off in about 12 hours, so it will be just -- golf's golf. I'll just work on a couple things I've been working on and go play.

**Q. You get up on the first tee this afternoon, what's your plan of attack, do you have a number in mind, were you just -- you kind of touched on it, was there a goal?**

**MICHAEL JOHNSON:** Usually I try to shoot in the 60s, that way I can pace myself, not get too excited, not get too down on myself, and 2 under is in the 60s this week. I was real patient. I had a bunch of pars and I birdied 12 and then had not a very good par on the par 5, and made a bunch of par putts, which was nice. I played really well on the back side.
