



Q. Great round today, obviously got to love the way you finished there with 8 under today.

GRAHAM DeLAET: Yeah, I mean, I felt like I played pretty good Thursday and Friday as well, barely made the cut on the number because I wasn't making any putts so it was nice on the weekend to see the putts go in, especially today.

Q. What's it like playing the first round without the beard, or the first tournament without the beard?

GRAHAM DeLAET: You know, it was a little bit -- I'm kind of 50/50 on it. Obviously it was a good week to do it because it's so hot here, but I miss it, too.

Q. What made you do it?

GRAHAM DeLAET: Mostly just because my kids are kind of pulling on it. I couldn't really snuggle and get close them and they didn't really like it.

Q. What's it like to have a good finish like this with six weeks left before the FedExCup Playoffs, make a move there?

GRAHAM DeLAET: I haven't had a great year. I haven't played a whole lot so it's nice, especially going into Canada next week, which is my national Open, to have a little bit of momentum is a good thing.

Q. Absolutely. What do you think of Glen Abbey, is it a good course for your game, and what's it like to go back to the home folks? I know they want someone to win so bad from there.

GRAHAM DeLAET: Yeah, I've never really played great at Glen Abbey but I feel like it's a course that I can play well at. It's always nice going home and being in front of the home crowd and I'm really looking forward to it.

Q. Can you talk a little bit about today?

GRAHAM DeLAET: Yeah, I mean, obviously it was a good day. I got off to a good start, I birdied the first two and everybody was just kind of throwing in random birdies from time to time and made a nice eagle on 16, which is my seventh hole, and that kind of really jump started me. But yeah, obviously anytime you shoot 63 you've got to make some putts so

obviously the putter was work well, too.

Q. Well, up until two days ago this would have tied the course record so obviously it's a pretty good round. Making a run late here so who knows what can happen, some guys are backing up, some guys moving up. Where do you think you're going to wind up here?

GRAHAM DeLAET: You know, I don't really know. I don't think I'm going to win the golf tournament but at the same time I'm happy to have a little momentum going into Canada next week. It's my national Open so it's something that's really important to me, so this is a good step forward for me because I haven't really had confidence probably since Houston or Hilton Head, so it's been a while, three months I guess kind of thing and my game feels pretty good right now.

Q. How hard are the putts to read on 9? I felt like it was giving so many people trouble.

GRAHAM DeLAET: Is that right? I don't know, I just thought it was a lot faster of a putt than it was because so shiny down grain. Obviously it would have been really nice to make that and get one more, but at the same time I made plenty today and I'm happy with my round.

Q. I know you said you were working to get the confidence back. This is back-to-back good finishes with Barracuda as well. What's kind of been the change recently, what do you feel worked well this week?

GRAHAM DeLAET: I mean, I just kind of feel like all year it's just been -- there's always been something that hasn't been working. One week I don't drive it well, one week I don't putt it well, one week I'm not chipping well, I'm not hitting it square, whatever it is. I finally feel like all aspects of my game are coming together. Nothing's like super, super sharp right now, but I feel like it's really close.
