

DAVE SENKO: David, pretty good finish. You were 6 under over your last 15 holes after that double at No. 3.

DAVID FROST: Yeah, I played steady golf today. Just was unlucky on that hole. I drove it in the fairway bunker and got it out and then hit a poor third shot. What can I say, I played the hole badly. And after birdieing the first hole, I was now all of a sudden 1-over par, but struck the ball really well from there, had some good chances but luckily -- well, I had some good chances I didn't capitalize on. Luckily, making a 3 on the last kind of eased the pain a little bit.

DAVE SENKO: What was the shot sequence on 18?

DAVID FROST: 18, you know, you can take a chance and try and go over the right side, but I figured if you did hit a good shot over the right side, you can't really -- you don't have the length of the green to play up on so I'd rather play it up the left side and I had a clear shot in. Luckily, I hit a good 3-wood that finished about 12 feet behind the hole from about 260 yards. That was a good break, and luckily the putt went in. It was a little downhill 12-footer so, as I say, eased the pain a little bit.

DAVE SENKO: How about your birdies on 12 and 15?

DAVID FROST: On 12 I hit it to about a foot from about 95 yards, 90 yards with a 58-degree. And then the par 5 15th I chipped it to about a foot as well. So I played very steady golf. Missed quite a few birdies in between, missed from 10 feet on 10, six feet on 11, 16 I missed from about 12 feet behind the hole. So I missed a couple but the greens are very tricky, very quick and it's hard leaving it below the hole where you want to putt from because the balls take a nice big bounce on the first landing. So there's nothing much you can do about that, you've just got to kind of putt defensively, but hopefully the ball just tumbles in the hole.

Q. A lot of scores under par, it's kind of bunched up. Did it feel like it was playing fairly easy today?

DAVID FROST: Well, the greens are quite receptive although it takes this big first bounce and then stops. I remember last year the greens were a lot harder than they are this year so I think that's why the scores are a little lower this year. You know, the golf course is just in great shape. The fairways are beautiful, the greens are really nice. It's just a pleasure to come and play here. You know, you can go at some of the flags. A couple of the par 3s are not their full length, especially 13. 13's only playing about an 8-iron. You know, there's not a difficulty factor; if you drive it well, the golf course is right in front of you. The fairways are quite -- they're not very narrow so they're quite forgiving so you can attack the ball once you're in the fairway. As I say, the greens are receptive and that's why the scores are low. And the par 5s are playing reachable so that makes the golf course play a par 70 I'd say.

Q. This is an extremely hot day for this climate.

DAVID FROST: For you guys.

Q. Yeah, yeah.

DAVID FROST: No, coming from Florida and being in Columbus and being in Minnesota the past month, it's warm here but we don't have the humidity, which is very nice. I enjoy it, I enjoy it like this.

Q. The Wine Spectator rankings, should people really believe that?

DAVID FROST: It's an indication, it's an indication. The only thing, they say they do blind tastings but they actually do blind tastings by regions, they don't do blind tasting blind. They'll say okay, we're tasting South Africa today so we'll taste it blind, or we'll taste Italy or Napa.

Q. You own a vineyard, right?

DAVID FROST: I do, in south Africa.

Q. What do you enjoy more, playing golf or making wine?

DAVID FROST: Well, I've got a good little gig going so I'm enjoying both avenues now. I've done a national deal with Trader Joe's so you can get my wine all over the country in all their stores.

Q. What's the brand?

DAVID FROST: It's my name, Dave Frost, so that's great fun. I've done probably 14,000 cases this year with Trader Joe's. We make a red blend and Sauvignon blanc.

Q. Those are the two at Trader Joe's?

DAVID FROST: Yeah.

Q. Red blend?

DAVID FROST: And Sauvignon blanc. It's very nice. \$8 on the red and \$7 on the white.

Q. It's more expensive than three bucks?

DAVID FROST: Everybody says that, whenever I mention Trader Joe's, they think Three Buck Chuck. No, it's nice. I donated some wine to the media at, where was it? Oh, the U.S. Open.
