Q. What was the key to your good round today, Louis?

LOUIS OOSTHUIZEN: I mean, I would have liked to probably be better off the tee today, I was a few times in the sandy areas. But putted nicely, I gave myself a lot of birdie opportunities. So yeah, with the golf course the way it was today with no breeze, I think you could see on the scoring the guys were going quite low.

Q. How important was your quick start today to continue that momentum you kind of built yesterday a little bit?

LOUIS OOSTHUIZEN: Yeah, I think it was just, you know, it was important to start just to get a couple under on the front. There's a part in the middle of the round where you can really make a few birdies. But yeah, it was just a nice solid round, nothing really spectacular. But I didn't make a bogey, I'll take a lot out of that, and the rest was just pretty solid.

Q. A couple bogeys yesterday but today spotless. You like it when your card is clean?

LOUIS OOSTHUIZEN: Yeah. I mean, I think anyone playing would like to keep bogeys off. I mean, I finished a bit poorly yesterday but still hit the ball pretty good. So I think you can expect really low scoring tomorrow and Sunday, so need to keep the birdies coming.

Q. The wind is going to blow up, do you think the scores will remain low on the weekend?

LOUIS OOSTHUIZEN: I don't know. If it blows like it did in the pro-am, I think the scoring won't be that low. But depends, if you get the wind where the par 5s are downwind, you might score well on them, so we'll see.
