Q. Leish, you've had some really good results here, three top 10s. Is that going to give you solve confidence going into tomorrow?

MARC LEISHMAN: Yeah, it definitely won't hurt. Yeah, knowing I contended here before is good. I think I'll learn a bit or learn a lot from not winning. I feel like you learn more from not winning than you do from winning. So I feel I'll draw on that, those experiences, and hopefully come late tomorrow afternoon I can be there and hopefully give myself another good shot.

Q. What do you think's going to be the key tomorrow for you personally?

MARC LEISHMAN: If I can drive it like I did today, that would be really good. I felt like I gave myself a lot of green light sort of shots into greens, so really happy with the driver. And then, you know, obviously holing the putts is key around here. Do those things well, it's the beginning, but you've still got to have things go your way.

Q. Why do you feel like you've had success at the South Course, especially how tough a course it is?

MARC LEISHMAN: I mean, I love that golf course. It's one of my favorites in the world. I spoke about it before, it's in my top-5 in the world. I guess when you enjoy playing a course, it's easy to play well. Well, not easy to play well, have more chance at playing well. It's the same grass as I grew up on. I grew up on poa greens and kikuyu fairways so that's probably got something to do with it. Along the ocean, it's a great spot, enjoy the views and hopefully enjoy a lot of birdies tomorrow.
