

Q. It just seemed to be one of those days where they weren't going in for you and a little bit of frustration out there because of that?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yeah, I didn't play very well. To be honest with you, I didn't hit it very good. I did a great job of hanging in there all day and trying to give myself chances. For whatever reason the putts just didn't want to go. I think I had four lip-outs yesterday and at least three today. That's just the way it goes. You've got to try to overcome that and fight that and I didn't do a good job today of doing that.

Q. It was definitely a roller coaster because as you said you would fight back from a slightly loose swing and then you'd have a chance and it looked like it'd be going in and then so you were riding the ups and downs for sure, yeah?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yeah, it's tough. I felt like I had a good chance today. Didn't play the last the way I should have. I didn't make putts I should have made, I didn't hit it as good as I should have. So I'm disappointed. This is a tournament I know how to win, done it before, so kind of upset with myself that I kind of let the opportunity pass by.

Q. I know it's raw right now but it is another really good week obviously. Defending champion, you gave it a good shake, not often we get that.

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yeah, I played really well. There's lots of positives from week and tomorrow I'll be able to see that. Right now it's a little -- just upset the way I kind of battled out there. I battled hard, but you're going to find if you want to be great at this game or really, really good at this game, you'll find ways to get through adversity and I didn't do a good job of that today. I'll hit the drawing board. I have a week off, I'll hit the drawing board, fix what went wrong today. Get ready for Pebble, another place I love a lot.

Q. How hard is it when you're in that battle and it was obviously so condensed, it looked like 20 guys could still win and all of a sudden birdie-eagle and the guy's at 13?

BRANDT SNEDEKER: Yeah, I didn't pay too much attention to it all day. I knew if I birdied 11, the par 3, I said okay, man, I'm going to have two par 5s left, 9 under par. If I can sneak in two more, I kept thinking 13 would be the number, 12 or 13. So I knew I had to get some stuff to get it going and just wasn't able to hit a golf shot to have the opportunity to do that.
