



Q. Daniel, you found eight birdies out on that golf course today, including a clean card for your inward nine.

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah, I played really well and kind of picked the course apart. Just having a lot of fun. My caddie's not having that much fun, he's been sick all week, so hopefully he can hang in there and the next couple days will be easy.

Q. I tell you, making birdies makes that bag lighter. I have saw you out here earlier in the week grinding on the putting green. You've putted well all year, I think you're 16th in strokes gained putting. Is it a big adaption this week?

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah, there's a little bit. They've got some wobble in them so you've really got to trust your lines, but when you make a few and you see a few go in, the rest is easy, so that's kind of how it was this week.

Q. There seems to be so much going on with the golf course with the elevation change, uphill, downhill, plus you have to decide on a strategy because there's a lot of risk-reward holes out here. Do you pretty much have it down now, do you understand the golf course?

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah, I think the best way to play it is to just put your ball in the fairway. If you hit driver on some of these holes that you could hit irons on, it makes it a lot tougher. So that's been kind of been my -- the way to play it for me.

Q. That birdie on 9 was in all the way, wasn't it?

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah. I thought I missed that by about a foot, somehow it went in.
