



Q. Jon, another round of 67 today, you must be very pleased with that?

JON RAHM: Extremely, yeah. You know, it was a little bit of up and down. I started a little, just a little weird. I was hitting good shots, feeling good, but the ball wasn't doing what I wanted and I'm 3 over for 3. Then I kind of pulled it back. Hit a great drive on 4, made a birdie and that kind of got the round going. I feel like it's really hard to make birdies on the front nine. After let's say No. 6, 7, 8, 9 are hard holes, it's not the easiest. Luckily I was able to hit a couple of them close on the back nine and made some birdies.

Q. After three rounds are you still learning about this golf course?

JON RAHM: Of course. It's the beauty of old-style golf course like this, right? You have so many different options, so many different strategies off the tee that you learn something every day. You really have to take into consideration where the pin's going to be and what second shot you want to have. There's been holes like on 16 today where I hit 5- and 4-irons, today I hit driver and I had 60 yards to the pin and the other days I had 140. So it really doesn't mean it's going to be easier, but sometimes that will help. Kind of paid off today on the back nine.

Q. You've already got on a win on Tour obviously this season but does that help when you're nicely in touch going into the final day?

JON RAHM: Well, you know, they always say the first one is the hardest. When you're in that situation that happened to make, I was in that situation twice and just wanted that first win so bad that sometimes it can hurt you. Luckily, I learned from it. I did it properly at the Farmers Insurance Open and hopefully this week I can be in that position again, who knows. It's the best players in the world and I'm pretty sure a couple of them are going to play really good tomorrow. Hopefully, I'm one of those.
