



Q. Ross, nine birdies and three bogeys. Just talk us through that final round.

ROSS FISHER: Yeah, wow. Yeah, it was decent. It was obviously great fun playing with Sergio, obviously Spanish here in Mexico, so there's a lot of support for him. And I played with Daniel a few times, so just tried to have a lot of fun out there. Yesterday was a tough day, you know. I didn't feel like I quite had it, whereas today I felt like I stuck to the game plan, played aggressive where I needed to and felt like I putted a lot better today. Yesterday, missed a few. I missed a couple today, but just kind of kept the ball in play. When I was off line, I got a little bit unlucky on 14, just in the right rough, hits a tree, kicks into the rough and made bogey there. Didn't really make a couple of good swings on 15, but then to finish 3-2-3, obviously fantastic to see your name up on that leaderboard close to the top is a satisfying end to what's been a great week.

Q. They have been a very appreciative crowd here and they enjoyed that approach into 18.

ROSS FISHER: Yeah, especially after I hit a really good putt on 16 and I holed a lovely putt on 17 and I just stuck to the game plan. Hit 4-iron off the tee on the last there and knew I had to draw it because the bunker on the right was in play. Woody's been fantastic this week with the numbers, meters for yards, and then obviously the percentage with the altitude, it's been a trying, patience, frustrating week in some sense for the caddies but Woody really did his job fantastically well this week and gave me a good number. Just kind of nice little soft pitching wedge in there, throw it up there pin high and we kind of got a pretty much similar read. To see it drop in there was great.

Q. Some big events coming up, you can take plenty of positives out of this week?

ROSS FISHER: Yeah, definitely. It was one I was looking forward to. I knew it was probably last chance to get yourself into the Masters. Whether that's done me enough, but hopefully that should have done me enough to get into the Match Play because I think I was 72nd heading into this week. So have to see where that puts me where everyone finishes but hopefully that's enough for me to get into the Match Play. World ranking-wise, whether it pushes me to the top 50, I don't know. We'll have to wait and see tomorrow. But I gave it my all, and if I get into the Masters, fantastic, and if not, it can't be for want of trying.

Q. (Inaudible.)

ROSS FISHER: Yeah, yesterday was a tough day. I think (inaudible) it felt like I was playing 16 at Scottsdale for all 18 holes with Phil and Rory. I was expecting it to be a little bit quieter today, but obviously with Sergio alongside us, there was still a big crowd. Just

wanted to go out there and play how I played the first two days. I felt like I played well, but distance control and my putting yesterday was a little bit off. I really wanted to come out and shoot a good score and felt like I played pretty flawless today. I only hit maybe a couple of loose shots, one bad break on 14 where it went in the right rough, hit a tree and kicked into the trees, but I took my medicine. Unfortunately, made a bogey there. But to hole those three putts on the last three holes shooting 65 on a Sunday in a WGC, I'm obviously delighted.
