**Q. Joel, first of all, congratulations on finishing third place in the fall swing Birdies Fore Love competition here. I'm hoping you can just start by telling us a little bit about the Send It Foundation and why it was your charity of choice.**

**JOEL DAHMEN:** Yeah, certainly. The Send It Foundation is based out of Truckee, California. It's for young adult cancer patients or young adults who have survived cancer. There's a lot of stuff for pediatrics, there's also for elder, but there's not a lot for the young adults. It's like 18 to 35.

So being a cancer survivor myself, I touched base with this organization about four or five years ago and I've always just kept in touch with them. Been able to donate a little bit throughout the years, but to be able to donate \$50,000 for them is awesome and it will definitely go a long ways.

**Q. Absolutely. And you talk about a foundation that is obviously near and dear to your heart for a number of reasons going back four or five years, with the help of your play this fall swing and with the contribution of RSM, to be able to make that \$50,000 donation, can you put that into words?**

**JOEL DAHMEN:** I mean, no. It's crazy. I thought about it earlier this week. I knew about the program all along, but I didn't know that I was close. When I found out I was close, I was playing for a little extra this week, I was a couple shots outside of the cut line with nine to play on Friday and I was like, I need to make the cut so I can make more birdies this weekend.

So I've never been able to play for anything like that. It's just a really, really cool thing for RSM to do. I know that I actually got to play with J.J. Spaun earlier in the week and we were talking about it. We were kind of chasing each other down for birdies trying to pass each other.
