CHARLES HOWELL III (-19, won 2nd playoff hole)

CHARLES HOWELL III: Well, I messed it up early starting off bogey-double. Yeah, I thought I shot myself right in the foot on that one. Fortunately, I was able to hang in there and the guys didn't run away too much until the end there to make some birdies. Yeah, I kind of thought after the bogey-double, I just said, well, you've done it again, but was able to somehow turn it around.

Q. Was there a pep talk along the way that you gave yourself?

CHARLES HOWELL III: I just kept reminding myself just to hang in there, that it was a long day, there were a lot of holes left, a lot of birdie holes left. In a weird way what might have worked against me early started to kind of work for me at the end because I had a chance to kind of somewhat recover.

You know, seeing Patrick post that 19 under par, those last few holes all of a sudden it became, okay, you've got to do this. My goodness, for that putt to go in, I'm still shocked.

Q. It's been over a decade since you won on the PGA TOUR. What does this mean to you?

CHARLES HOWELL III: Oh, man, it means a lot because I've hung in there and it means a lot. I've had moments where I didn't know if I would ever win again, so it means that I can still do it, that I can still compete out here, you know, with the changing of the competition. I played with Cameron Champ the last two days, the guy hits a 3-iron 290 yards. The game is changing and golf is changing. You know, I'm almost to turn 40, so I've got to hang in there and do my best.
