

TALOR GOOCH (-12)

Q. Interesting day looking at your scorecard, off to a good start and then a couple of miscues, just talk about that, and then obviously a good back nine.

TALOR GOOCH: Yeah. I mean, it's never fun making double bogeys from the middle of the fairways, but I hit a bad shot that combined with another bad shot and we had to shake it off.

Last week on Saturday I think I was 2 over through three as well and came back and shot a decent score, so I could draw back from that experience. Out here it can go bad in a hurry, it can go good in a hurry, you just have to stay patient and wait for your turn.

Q. Is that what you do? How do you stay patient and wait for your turn? How do you process that after a start like that?

TALOR GOOCH: You know, at this point in my career I've played enough golf that I've been 3 or 4 under and shot 3 or 4 over and I've been 3 or 4 over early and shot 3 or 4 under. This game comes in strides and you just have to have belief and faith that it's going to start turning your way.

Q. What's it been like for you starting this season with conditional status and these last two weeks you're obviously getting in the mix, playing well? How satisfying is that and how challenging has it been?

TALOR GOOCH: You know, experience is only taught through experience. Last year being my first year on Tour, I can't tell you how much more comfortable I am out on these courses just from a preparation standpoint. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, it looks and feels so much different, I'm just so much more comfortable. That definitely will help. In this game comfort is of the utmost importance. The more comfortable you are, the better golf you're going to play. I'm a lot more comfortable this year.

Q. Speaking of that, how will the approach be tomorrow? How comfortable will that be for you being in the mix in the last few groups here?

TALOR GOOCH: Yeah, you know, last week is a good example. It's the first one of a few times since being on Tour that I've kind of come through, so it's nice to have a very recent experience where the final round I was in the thick of things and I played well. I had a few other experiences last year where I was in the thick of things and it didn't go so well, but, you know, those are things I've learned from and hopefully I can put those tough lessons to use tomorrow.
