

ROGER SLOAN (-7)

Q. One shot back of the lead right now. How would you describe your round today, what was working well for you?

ROGER SLOAN: I just kind of plugged it along today. You know, breezy conditions, so you can't get too ahead of yourself, you've just got to go one shot at a time, as clichÉ as it sounds. It's kind of easy to settle into a round that way. Not expecting too much. We rolled in a couple putts, we had a little dunk there on 17 and end of the day it added up to 67.

Q. Walk me through that eagle on 17.

ROGER SLOAN: Yeah, you know, downwind, it's nice to close those last three holes downwind because you've been fighting into the wind what seems like most of the afternoon or morning. Hit a 3-wood down there. We had 67 yards and, yeah, we just threw in a little 60-degree wedge. It landed nicely and it rolled and went in, so that's pretty cool.

Q. You've had a handful of starts so far this year on the PGA TOUR. What does this kind of do for your confidence to know that, hey, a low round's in me and hopefully we can string two more good ones together?

ROGER SLOAN: I'm not too concerned with all that. My job out here is to go out and hit one shot at a time and kind of take care of business. I learned a lot my first year on Tour, so I'm applying all those lessons and making all those necessary adjustments for this year.

I'm excited for the rest of the summer. The calendar year's just kind of getting started. We're almost here at the midpoint of the season, but I'm excited for the next few months, it's going to be good.
