

MARTIN TRAINER (-10)

Q. How good did it feel to birdie the last hole going into Sunday?

MARTIN TRAINER: Felt great. I was in a good position off the tee, and I just wanted to hit it up there somewhere by the green and hopefully have a chance to make a birdie, and I ended up making my birdie putt, which is just a total bonus. I'm happy with the position I'm in.

Q. What was the key to your round today?

MARTIN TRAINER: It was rough in the middle. I couldn't really make any birdies. And I had some chances. I hit a ball in the water. And so this is how golf goes. I don't know if you heard, but it goes up and down. But I was able to rally at the end and make a few birdies, which feels really good.

Q. Will you be able to draw on your appearance from winning twice on the Web Tour last year before tomorrow?

MARTIN TRAINER: Definitely. I mean, those instances I was playing under a lot of pressure trying to succeed and make it into the PGA Tour. And now there is a similar pressure to try to stay out here. And so this is a great opportunity for me. And regardless of what happens, I just want to stay calm and relaxed and try to do my best.

Q. Excited for a chance to win on the PGA Tour?

MARTIN TRAINER: Sure. That sounds great. That's what I've been working for, for all these years.

Q. Do you have like a normal routine, I guess before tournament rounds, and do you think it will change at all when you're in contention at a PGA Tour?

MARTIN TRAINER: I don't think so. I mean, I just want to make sure I get all my bases: Eat in the morning, hydrate. It's hot out here, so you have to stay hydrated. So all the little things like that, to just try to be -- feeling good on the first tee and try to be able to perform my best.

Q. It's pretty windy out here. Do you consider yourself a strong wind player based on what (inaudible) just experiences getting to this level?

MARTIN TRAINER: Yeah. I mean, to a certain extent, I think you have to be able to play in

the wind to make it here. But I'm -- I think this course suits me more because it's just a long bomber's course, so I can hit a lot of drivers and try to get as far down there as I can and not worry about hitting one too far offline. So I think that's been a big benefit.

Q. For sure. If you had to pick a best shot of the day?

MARTIN TRAINER: Probably -- can I make it like a combined up-and-down on the 18th hole? I think I will take that one.

Q. How would you kind of assess your season so far? Is it a lot of learning I guess out there, you think?

MARTIN TRAINER: Yeah. I mean, it's hard to just come out there and play well right away. And I struggled in the fall to start the wrap-around season, and the last few events I have started playing really well. And so this kind of tops it off as a culmination of the improvement I guess over the offseason, and we'll see what happens.
