Q. 6 under par today. When you came and teed off first thing, did you have a number in mind that you were trying to get to?

DANIEL BERGER: I thought 14 was probably where I had to be, and I still think it's going to be 14. But I just -- I played pretty well today. And throughout the week, I did not ball-strike it very well, and so it was kind of just one of those weeks where I putted well and chipped it well. So, today I hit it pretty much similarly as bad, but made a few more putts.

Q. How were you doing (inaudible)?

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah, finally healthy. I'm playing the next four events. So, hopefully no changes in that. But I came here because I wanted to kind of get going on the year. I only played three events, which is kind of unusual for me. Usually at this point in the season, I played more. So, I kind of just wanted to get some reps in, and it was a great week, so I'm excited that I did make the stop here.

Q. I was going to ask about that. Is it maybe one of those things where you were hoping for some momentum to get rolling and obviously with a good result here maybe you have started something?

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah, a little bit. Like I said, I just haven't played very many competitive rounds. I mean, since the -- since the second or third playoff event, I have played three events. So, it's been four or five months and I'm just kind of hanging around, getting ready to go. So, I'm fresh and I'm ready to play.

Q. Are you looking forward to maybe trying to qualify for the Presidents Cup team again and all that sort of stuff?

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah. I mean, that stuff's so far away right now, I just got to kind of stay patient and just continue to do the things that I have been working on in the off season. But obviously that's a big goal of mine. So, results -- good results will help take care of that.

Q. Awesome. That's all I needed.

Q. One quick question. First time here. Just your thoughts on the people that -- the hospitality, the course, just obviously don't want to say anything, but just being here is obviously nice.

DANIEL BERGER: Yeah. I have never been to Puerto Rico. I have heard a lot of great things about it. I have friends from Puerto Rico. And a couple years ago, I played well at the Honda, and I was supposed to play here and I didn't, so I kind of made it a thing that I was going to come back at some point, so this kind of just fit the schedule here. But overall it's been unbelievable. The food has been fantastic. The golf course is in great condition. You would have never known how much catastrophe was here so recently. It's -- it looks like it's up and running as usual. So, obviously the maintenance staff and all the crew here has done an incredible job.
