

**ROUND 2 INTERVIEW**  
**June 22, 2019**



**BILLY ANDRADE (-10)**

**Q. Billy, bogey-free 6 under on the day.**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Yeah.

**Q. Tell us about your round.**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Great day all around. Started with a birdie on 1 and made three more on the front, and then birdied the two par 5s on the back. Had a chance on 18. I hit a nice shot in there about 10 feet, knocked the first putt about five feet by and made a nice come-backer.

So, very happy with where I'm at. I know it's probably not going to lead probably before the day's over, but all you want to do is give yourself opportunities out here. I love this place and I'm looking forward to tomorrow.

**Q. From the time that you walked off the 18th green with the sole possession of the lead, now there's three other guys at 10. Is that life on this tour?**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Yeah, pretty much. I kind of knew probably had to get to 11 or 12 to probably have the lead going into tomorrow was just my thought. You never know what can happen. But yeah, this tour is all about making birdies and playing great golf because everybody that's up near the lead, they're all experienced golfers and they've all won and they're all great players. You've got to -- when you have the opportunities, you've got to make them if you're going to win.

**Q. It's been four years since you were able to come away with a win.**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Yeah.

**Q. Does that enter your thought process?**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Well, you know, I've had a pretty good year so far this year. I almost won a few times. Felt like I gave one away in Mississippi. But you know what, if I keep knocking on the door, maybe -- who the hell knows, maybe tomorrow's my day and I can break through. But I really can't think about that. I've got to just go out and play good golf and see where the chips fall.

Is it frustrating? Sure. I would like to sit here and say I've won 12, 14 times like Scott McCarron, but it hasn't happened. So good golf usually pays off and we'll see what

happens.

**Q. You mentioned that you love this place and obviously every (inaudible) year.**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Gorgeous, just gorgeous.

**Q. How special would this win be to you? I know there's a long day ahead tomorrow, but how special would it be?**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Well, I think all of us out here, that's what we want to do. You want to win, you want to taste that -- taste victory. You want to be able to go to Hualalai in January with your family and play in the Tournament of Champions there. Yeah, like I said, I love this place. It reminds me a lot of home, Rhode Island, and I would be honored to be Steve Stricker's champion here.

**Q. (Inaudible.)**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** I don't know, maybe more brats. I don't know, maybe some cheese curds. I don't know, we'll see. It will be fun no matter what.

**Q. You mentioned Strick. When you walked in, he chipped in for eagle to get to 10. I know things will shake out, but would you like to play with him?**

**BILLY ANDRADE:** Sure, absolutely. Might as well. You know, he's always there near the lead. I played with him in Alabama when he won in the third round and was the group ahead of him in the last round. So I enjoy playing with him. When you're playing with Steve, you know you're playing with the best and you've got to give it your all. So maybe we'll get a chance to do that tomorrow.
