ROUND 4 INTERVIEW June 30, 2019



DOC REDMAN (-19)

Q. Doc, you took care of a lot of your future business by taking care of business today. What a fun Sunday that had to be to play.

DOC REDMAN: Yeah, it was awesome. The crowds were great today. They were very lively and loud and that was awesome. It was a beautiful day to play golf, so there's really nothing to complain about, and it was a plus that I played well.

Q. Aggressive out there today, too. Some of the lines you took, hitting driver there. I thought the tee shot at 13 to put you in position for that wedge was really huge for that round to get that shot back.

DOC REDMAN: Yeah, I kind of struggled with that tee shot all week. It's just kind of -- I think everyone, it's a weird tee shot. But I thought if I could hit a good drive I would have 70 yards in, which I hit two really good ones early in the round, so I said if I can do that, I can make birdie. Hit a good drive and hit a good approach shot and made the putt, so that was really cool.

Q. Okay. So you can take your name out of the Monday qualifier for next week. Special temporary membership on the PGA TOUR, Open Championship. Can you wrap your head around all of that at once?

DOC REDMAN: No, no, I hadn't even thought about it really. I knew what was at stake, but I was trying not to think about it. I actually didn't even think about The Open Championship until someone said it to me after. But it's awesome, I can't wait.

Q. What were you thinking about down the stretch? We knew this was Nate's tournament pretty much in the early going, it was sort of that tournament for second place. How did you approach it? Were you looking at things out there?

DOC REDMAN: Well, yeah. I mean, I looked at things, but I didn't let it bother me. I wanted to just keep having opportunities at birdie. I was putting well and I gave myself a lot of opportunities. I kind of faltered a little bit, two three-putts on the back nine stunk, but yeah, I was just -- I think, you know, if I hadn't had those two three-putts, maybe a little more pressure on Nate, but just trying to hit good shots.

Q. From a Monday qualifier to solo second. Doc, did you have any idea what was at stake over that par putt on the last hole?

DOC REDMAN: Yeah, I knew solo second would be huge and not a three-way tie for

second, or even four with Patrick coming down the stretch.

It was an easy uphill putt and I just tried to focus on putting a good stroke on it, and I did that and it went in.

Q. How surreal was the week going from Monday to Sunday now that you have special temporary membership as well as a trip to Royal Portrush?

DOC REDMAN: Yeah, it's awesome. It went by really quick. I was just trying to play well every day and I did that. It's awesome. It's awesome playing out here and I'm glad I get the opportunity to do that.

Q. As far as the trip to Royal Portrush, how much are you looking forward to --

DOC REDMAN: Yeah, I actually just learned that not long after I got off the course. I didn't even think about that, but I can't wait. I've never been over there, it's going to be an awesome experience and, you know, I can't wait to see how it is.

Q. Has it sunk in yet that you have special temporary? You go from having to grind on a Monday to, I mean, you're going to be playing every week.

DOC REDMAN: No, no, it hasn't sunk in, but in the next few hours it definitely will and it's a great feeling.
