CASE COCHRAN (-9)

Q. Case, excellent round today. If we can get some comments on your play.

CASE COCHRAN: That was a lot of fun. I had a finish where I honestly was cramping up a little bit, was super just hot and getting a little tired, and I hit a 9-iron and it went right in the hole on No. 7. That kind of shocked me into finishing strong. And then I eagled the next hole as well, so that was a load of fun.

Q. Have you ever had a stretch like that?

CASE COCHRAN: I have had a low stretch like that. My wife, Ashton, caddied for me in the Dominican Republic on PGA Latinoamerica and I went eagle and then holed out a pitching wedge, so exact same.

I laughed pretty hard because I told my caddie, I was like -- who's my brother, older brother. I said, "I really hope that didn't send her into labor." She's 34 weeks pregnant, traveled from Dallas, so that was exciting.

Q. Her name?

CASE COCHRAN: Her name Ashton.

Q. So now all of a sudden with those two eagles, now you're looking at starting the weekend in the top-10.

CASE COCHRAN: Absolutely.

Q. How does that sort of change your outlook from where you were earlier in the round?

CASE COCHRAN: Just puts a smile on my face. That's just the opportunity that I wanted coming into this week. So thankful to Barbasol and the people in Kentucky to give me a sponsor invite, so I'm just trying to make the best of that.

Q. Your particular circumstances with the father who's a professional golfer, too, what's that like growing up and kind of chasing that?

CASE COCHRAN: Well, that's all I've wanted to do since I grew up. I love the frenzy out here, I love the camaraderie that the PGA TOUR's always been, and there was nothing I wanted more to do than continue that family tradition.
