

ROUND 4 INTERVIEW
July 21, 2019



JOSH TEATER (-21)

Q. Josh, nice to see that one go in on the last hole to finish up in a great way.

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, for sure. Kind of looked like I wasn't going to win, so we kept trying to make as many as we could, you know, and create a little bit of separation. Always good to birdie the last.

Q. Talk about the day as a whole just in terms of the delay and everything.

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, you know, seven was unfortunate. Hit some bad chips around the green, one there, and just compounded it with a bad first putt. I think it was maybe good to get that break for me. Came out and birdied eight, 10 and 11 and off and rolling. And 14, I'd like to have that one back. And obviously 15, trying to get it in there and make a three or four and had to work for my five, but glad that went in.

Q. How nice was it to come up 18, get the round of applause and then sink the -- what was it, a 20-footer or so?

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, something like that.

Q. How cool was that to finish like that?

JOSH TEATER: It was awesome, you know. So much support out here, so thankful for it. You know, just glad to be here and have so many people following me.

Q. You're going to Reno?

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, I head to Reno tomorrow, play there the next week. Hopefully make as many birdies and catch all those points in the Stableford system and keep building on this. And then from there to Greensboro for the last one and hopefully sneak in those playoffs.

Q. What can a tournament like this do for you going forward?

JOSH TEATER: I mean, obviously you can pull a lot of great stuff from it; confidence, you know. I made a lot of putts, made I don't know how many birdies. So I'm just going to try to keep rolling off the good stuff and finish off strong.

Q. And you said you can get in the Korn Ferry if you don't --

JOSH TEATER: I'm in that, for sure, yeah. I mean, I'm not going to fall outside the top-200. Kind of same outlook, let it fly. If I miss the two cuts, oh, well. If I win, even better.

Q. You talked about that mindset yesterday. Was that from the get-go this week or just --

JOSH TEATER: Yeah, I feel like I've kind of been trying to break through the wall, you know. I've played nice rounds and I've had double bogeys like I did this week on the 10th hole the first day and seven today. But instead of harping on that when it happens, I just kind of use it to fuel me and say I'm just going to make more birdies. Obviously here we were able to do that and you're going to have some stuff. In this game you're going to get punched in the face a little and you've just got to learn to punch back.
