

**BILLY HORSCHEL (-10)**

**Q. Billy, 68, 67, 65.**

**BILLY HORSCHEL:** Holed A few more putts. Yeah, holed some yesterday and still I missed a lot of putts inside 10 feet. But yeah, the putter's starting to feel better in my hands and I'm hitting it pretty good.

**Q. Give us a feel for how the golf course is playing.**

**BILLY HORSCHEL:** I think some of the pins are a little bit tougher on certain holes. Still very scorable, but you've just got to be respectful. There's really no wind, the greens are still really receptive, so the scores are out there, but you're going to have to hit good golf shots.

**Q. The PGA TOUR season comes to an end in three weeks' time, obviously the end of August. Gives you an opportunity to play elsewhere in the world. We're delighted to hear that you're going to play the BMW PGA Championship at Wentworth.**

**BILLY HORSCHEL:** I'm excited. I used to watch that event when I was growing up. It was usually the first week we got out of school here in the States, in Florida, and I stayed home instead of going to the golf course that week. I watched it early in the morning, woke up early and watched the entire coverage. I know that the crowds are unbelievable, a lot of energy. Fans are great there. The course is a really solid golf course, always had a really good feel. So I'm excited to get over there and experience the BMW PGA Championship at Wentworth.

**Q. Trying to make your way to the TOUR Championship having won the FedExCup in the past. There's a new system in play this year, a graphic to sort of demonstrate it to our viewers. The guy leading the FedExCup going into the TOUR Championship will have a 10-shot lead basically over the guys that are down at the bottom. What do you think of that system having won it in the past?**

**BILLY HORSCHEL:** I think it's easier for the viewers to understand how it's all played out instead of the whole points system, how everything's going to be shuffling around. It was really tough to understand if someone's in eighth place and they were winning but the guy who's never won was in third place. There's a lot of information for the regular golf fan to take in. This is a little bit easier for the fans to understand. I think it may take a day or two to adjust and get used to.

The only thing I have told the Tour when we talked about it last year is if you're going to sort of change it up a little bit, let's make the odds a little bit better. Let's make, you know, from

first place to the last five places a little bit tighter. Let's have it really a shootout type deal. It's a playoff, it's the Super Bowl, it's the World Series. Let's give everyone a little bit better chance of winning the FedExCup. Because obviously down here I think the percentage chance of those guys winning is less than five percent type deal. So realistically, for someone to win here, they're going to have to play really well and everyone here has to play really bad.
