

ANDREW LANDRY (-14)

Q. You find yourself after four tough rounds inside the 125. Congratulations on making the FedExCup Playoffs. Your thoughts on how today went?

ANDREW LANDRY: It didn't go as planned. I was obviously trying to get myself in contention to win the golf tournament and I just kind of felt on the back nine I started thinking more of the FedExCup than it was winning a golf tournament. Like I said earlier, I'm good with an exemption for next year and it was definitely stress free, but for some odd reason it was on my mind to get into those Playoff events. You know, it's a big relief off my shoulders to be able to go play Northern Trust and try to get myself in the Top-70. My game's sharp right now, I'm playing really well and just looking forward to next week.

Q. What's it like, because the scoreboards aren't showing you much? What's going on out there as far as the FedExCup, the fluctuation that's going on out there? Do you just grind it out and hope at the end?

ANDREW LANDRY: Yeah, yeah, I figured 14th or better would get me in. I walked off the last hole knowing that I wasn't going to be in and you came up to me and said, "Hey, you're in right now." That's a little bit of a shock. I think that it all depends on what other players do. So the only thing you can control is your destiny and go out there and just try to do the best you can. Luckily, it worked out in my favor this time.

Q. Off to Liberty National next week and you said you like the state of your game right now.

ANDREW LANDRY: I do, yeah. I'm playing really well. I'm finally putting the ball better. Obviously it didn't show that much today, but I'm putting the ball better. I'm hitting my lines, my speed was just a little off. I hit a lot of good putts that I left right in the middle of the hole and just short. So definitely looking forward to going next week.

Q. You said all week that you wanted to go out and win the golf tournament. Was there a point today that that changed and you thought about the 125?

ANDREW LANDRY: Yeah, coming down really the back nine. Like I told you yesterday, the front nine is kind of where you need to score and I think getting out of there at 2 under with a bogey just wasn't very good, so I was a little sloppy to start the day. You know, here we are, so I'm happy to just get it done and be able to go play next week.

Q. Obviously disappointed not to win the tournament, but I mean, what are the emotions knowing that you will be playing next week in the Playoffs again?

ANDREW LANDRY: I mean, the emotions are high. This is something that you want. You want to go try to play the FedExCup and try to do your best and get yourself in the TOUR Championship. That's where our goals are every single year and it definitely makes you stress free whenever you can make that TOUR Championship. I know that I was really close last year, I think I was six spots out, so I've got a lot of work to do. Luckily, my game's coming around in the right direction at the right time.

Q. I know you have your card for next year so there's no stress there, but was there any stress with the uncertainty coming into this week?

ANDREW LANDRY: No, not really. I knew that this was a great golf course for me and I played well here in the past. I just needed to go out and just keep on doing what I've been doing. John Deere was a huge, huge tournament for me, to go out and make that putt on the last hole to finish solo third. Gave me some points to get myself back in the Top-125. That was kind of the turning point there.
