

**ROUND 4 INTERVIEW**

**Q. Welcome to the winner's circle. Bogey free for 72 holes. You're the first player to win doing that since Lee Trevino in the 1970s. A 62 to win a golf tournament. Which one stands out to you?**

**J.T. POSTON:** Gosh, I'd say probably the 62 on Sunday is definitely up there. I mean, bogey free's great. The golf course was easy enough to where if you hit fairways, you could attack some pins, and my iron play was really solid all week. So it was nice to give myself some looks, and today I finally made some putts and was able to get that low one in there.

**Q. You have to get off to a good start on this golf course. You did that. When you played your way up to the top of the board, how did this day come together for you to be in a position where you could continue to be aggressive, especially down the stretch? Your putting stroke looked so good, you were in a really good zone there.**

**J.T. POSTON:** Yeah, the putting's been great most of the year I feel like. And the ball-striking, I saw my swing coach on Monday and he gave me one little tip and it clicked right away and carried into this week.

But yeah, the putter was definitely the biggest part I would say down the stretch. Made some good par putts, and that one on 18 definitely had some nerves behind it. It was awesome.

**Q. You felt like it was trending to an opportunity for you to win out here on Tour. What did you learn from some of your experiences this year? You played late on the weekend in Detroit, you've been right there in some of those moments. What did you reflect on today to make this happen?**

**J.T. POSTON:** Yeah, that was kind of something I told myself going into those types of days was no matter what happens, I'm going to learn from it because I know I'm going to have other chances down the road. I felt like I was playing great all year and I knew I was going to have these opportunities.

So yeah, Detroit was kind of different starting the day in the final group six back from Nate, but there was still some nerves. There was still -- you know, it was a learning curve. I didn't get off to the best start and that was definitely something I was thinking about today was just keep doing what I'm doing and not think about the leaderboard necessarily, just go try and make a bunch of birdies and shoot a low score.

**Q. Once this rowdy bunch out here I think half of them figured out where you were**

**from, all of a sudden it became sort of a home field advantage for you. What was that like for you?**

**J.T. POSTON:** Yeah, it was awesome. I've got so many friends and family that are here coming in from all over the place. Some came in last night, some came in this morning. The celebration's going to be a lot of fun. There's a lot of Hickory cheers and a lot of Western Carolina cheers out there. I definitely heard them all day, so I can't wait to celebrate with them.
