MARCO DAWSON (-2)



Q. We're here with Marco Dawson here at the Ally Challenge. Well, Marco, how do you think you did today?

MARCO DAWSON: Better than yesterday. I made a few more putts today. The course played a little more difficult. It was windy today, a lot windier than yesterday.

Q. With the windier course, what are some of the advantages and disadvantages of that?

MARCO DAWSON: I don't know that there are any advantages really, unless you're playing really well, then it's an advantage because you can control your ball a lot better than the other guys that are struggling.

Disadvantages would be wind is inconsistent, so you could hit a shot, it would be good, and the next guy hits the same club, same shot but the wind picks up or lays down and he's either way short or way long. So it's the consistency of the wind.

Q. Playing here at the Ally Challenge, what's it been like?

MARCO DAWSON: The last two years have been good. It's been nice to come back since we haven't been here in a while. This was one of the longest running tournaments on the Tour, so it was nice to come back on this tour and play the event.

Q. What are the memories of the Buick Open?

MARCO DAWSON: It was very similar. There were a lot more people. I don't remember what time of year it was. I think it was, what, middle of summer?

Q. Yeah.

MARCO DAWSON: Okay. It was nice. And I have some friends that live up here, so it was nice.

Q. And the Ally Challenge extended to 2025. Your thoughts?

MARCO DAWSON: More sponsors we can get, the better. The five years or the six years means that they're in control of the next five or six years. They know how the event's going to be run, they've run it now for two years, so it should be easy for them.
