SLUGGER WHITE: The bottom line is we just don't have a golf course that's playable. We've got situations out there where we could lose balls in areas that we have no virtual certainty where it was. There's so many scenarios out there that just don't fit making an effort.

Q. Is the course -- I realize how much rain's fallen, but has it held up pretty well?

SLUGGER WHITE: No, no. Well, the golf course, no, it's completely, what agronomically is called field capacity. We're right at -- nothing's draining. Everything always drains to the mangroves here and there's no place for it to go with that much rain.

Q. And then what's Joe's prognosis for the immediate future?

SLUGGER WHITE: He's looking at maybe in another hour to hour and a half that we're looking at pop-up storms that could last anywhere -- with heavy downpours, last anywhere from a half hour to an hour, especially since it's starting to heat up. That's what he's looking at.

Q. And then tomorrow it's not looking a whole lot better?

SLUGGER WHITE: Tomorrow, unfortunately, is going to look almost about the same until we get here and see what happens. Unless something changes, I don't know. My crystal ball's pretty foggy right now.

Q. So if tomorrow is stop and go, obviously we'll just do whatever we can to get 72 holes in?

SLUGGER WHITE: Correct.

Q. Even if it means going to Monday?

SLUGGER WHITE: Yes, sir. Yes, indeed. Monday's always in the mix. Obviously we hope to finish on Sunday, but Monday will always be there.
