ADAM LONG: Exactly. Seeing one get in there tight and then you want to get in there a little closer and then the next guy wants to beat that, so it was a lot of fun. Two great guys to play with.

Q. It was a long wait to get to the round, and then as soft as that golf course was, was it as gettable as the score made it seem or did you have to kind of find ways to pick your spots on a saturated golf course?

ADAM LONG: It was pretty gettable. I mean, the Tour did a great job of like moving some of the tees up where the fairways were really saturated, so it was a lot of wedges. You had a lot of shots from 100 to 140 yards, so if you're hitting those in there tight, making some putts, you can definitely make a lot of birdies.

Q. So far, so good today in terms of the weather, but it's going to be another wait until you get to tee off again. How have you been biding your time as we start, stop, start, stop?
