

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW

BRENDON TODD (-11)

Q. Brendon, I know it's always hard to follow up a really low one out there, but you got off to a really good start on the more difficult side of this golf course and then the wind maybe played a little bit of tricks out there with you or anything, or just ran into a stretch there?

BRENDON TODD: I just didn't get the putts to fall on my second nine. I hit it to 25 feet, six feet, 12 feet, four feet, and then missed a 12-footer for par on five, had 20 feet on six, striped it at the flag on seven, missed the edge, and on eight I hit a close one in there about 10 feet and burned the edge. So I just didn't get the putts to fall in the second nine.

Q. Yeah, ball-striking is obviously really solid. You know a bogey's going to come and get you. Were you surprised at how it came and got you today at five?

BRENDON TODD: I was, but the way I'm playing with my irons in, I felt like the only way I was going to make a bogey was to miss a fairway, lose a golf ball, and that's what happened. But I'm sure it's going to happen to most guys this week. I'm just happy I hit some good shots after that and gave myself chances to make birdies coming in.

Q. Obviously in a good spot going into tomorrow. Knowing it's going to be as many holes as we can play, how do you approach a day like that when it's wall to wall, sunup to sundown type of golf?

BRENDON TODD: I think you get rest tonight and you stay patient tomorrow, but same game plan. We're going to have favorable conditions, so you can make a lot of birdies.
