

ROUND 1 INTERVIEW

BRIAN HARMAN (-5)

Q. Sixty-seven today, Brian, nice start. If we can get some comments on the round.

BRIAN HARMAN: Yeah, I played the par 5s really nice, holed a wedge, chipped one ball in. I've got to tighten it up around the greens a little bit. I had some more chances that I didn't convert, so I'm going to have to putt a little bit better to be in contention on the weekend, but shooting a good score the first day never hurts.

Q. What was the yardage on the wedge there on 15?

BRIAN HARMAN: It was 91, I do believe, 91. Lob wedge, drain-o.

Q. Talk a little bit about the conditions today and how the Plantation course played.

BRIAN HARMAN: Yeah, I thought it held up pretty good. I didn't know how they were -- obviously I live here so I've played it a handful of times. I thought they went a little more aggressive with the pins than I thought they would, I thought they would be a little more conservative, but the course held its own. They did a nice job, it's in beautiful shape and obviously it's very close to airplanes.

Q. And last, just talk a little bit about this being the last event of the fall, just about your fall season. A pretty solid start in a few tournaments. Just comment on how you feel about it.

BRIAN HARMAN: Yeah, a tough year last year. First three-quarters of the year were really, really hard. I struggled mentally, physically, and I finally kind of turned it on there towards the end. Got into the Playoffs, didn't make it past the first one, but I think I had a stretch there where I had four or five top-10s in a stretch of seven or eight tournaments. So I was excited about my game going into the fall. I've never done any good at Houston so that one's kind of a scratch-off for me, but I like where my game's at, I like where my head's at. Hopefully, tomorrow will go well.
