

ROUND 4 INTERVIEW

SEBASTIÁN MUÑOZ (-18)

Q. It was exciting there at the end. I thought at 15 you hit a great second shot, you had a really good look at eagle, and then you had good looks at 16, 17 and 18, don't you think?

SEBASTIÁN MUÑOZ: Yeah, I think, you know, I played good. You know, first maybe eight holes I was a little tight, I was too careful with my speed, and then I just kind of let it go and make a couple more putts and hit better shots and it was all good. I gave myself a chance on 18. It didn't happen this time, but it already did this year, so I'm happy.

Q. What a fall you've had, though, with the win at Sanderson Farms and now this, one shot out of the playoff. This has been a great start to the season for you.

SEBASTIÁN MUÑOZ: Yeah, it's been fantastic. You know, that's one of the things I aim with my coach, Troy Denton, to have a good fall, lock up the card in those seven events I played and, you know, just ready for next season to keep the top of the FedExCup.

Q. You're No. 2 right now, Brendon's still No. 1, but wow, that's important, isn't it?

SEBASTIÁN MUÑOZ: Yeah, it's huge. My goal No. 1 is getting to East Lake, so just keep trending in that direction, just keep staying in the top-10 and hold on.

Q. What do you do now before the Sentry Tournament of Champions in Maui? What's the plan? Do you take some time off?

SEBASTIÁN MUÑOZ: Yeah, major time off. Going to Bogota, seeing the family, friends and just relax for, I don't know, three, four weeks and then start practicing like 10 days before a tournament.

Q. I've got to ask you this. You're the only guy who didn't wear sleeves today. You wore a short-sleeved shirt all day and it was cold out there this morning. How did you do it?

SEBASTIÁN MUÑOZ: It was cold, but I've been in worse. Been in Dallas, we had some cold days and we were out there practicing so I knew how it was going to be and I don't like playing in a jacket. I'd rather play good than be warm.
