Q. You've gotten a chance to play both courses now. South Course recently redesigned. How do you feel about it?

CHARLEY HOFFMAN: It's a long golf course. Obviously the Tour didn't have much say in that, it's another organization that decided to do those changes. You know what, it's hard. You've got to play good golf. It's a big boy golf course.
