

PETER UIHLEIN (-6)

Q. Peter, kind of you to join us, 66 today, the wind pretty much sustainable at 20 miles an hour. How difficult was it out there and how good a round was this?

PETER UIHLEIN: It was definitely tricky. Anytime it gets this windy it makes it very difficult. But yeah, it was a good, solid day. I kept it kind of in front of me all day, didn't make too many mistakes and holed some nice putts.

Q. I want to go back to a shot that you hit on the seventh hole, 165 yards. Kenny gave me the signal, it was a 6-iron. Maybe the young guys might be hitting 8- or 9-iron out of the rough. Talk us through that shot. I thought it was an absolutely marvelous shot.

PETER UIHLEIN: Yeah, so when it gets this windy, really the number on the bottom of the club kind of becomes obsolete really, it's all about flight and what you want to hit, what you want to see. From that, I got a clean lie but I had a little mud on the side so I knew it was going to the squirt to the right and I just didn't (inaudible) totally too hard. It was just kind of a smarter shot, kind of kept it in front of me a little bit, didn't try to do too much. Yeah, it was solid.

Q. Curt Byrum first noticed you on the sixth hole, the impact rehearsal move, sort of broke it down a little bit on the ninth tee. What are you specifically working on with that rehearsal move?

PETER UIHLEIN: So trying to essentially keep my right arm a little bit more tucked to my body while rotating the lower body, keeping that moving. I tend to get almost a little bit too square at impact and the hips have to stall and then I kind of get a little disconnected. For me it's almost in a weird way it's kind of like Wolff's little wiggle he does but not as extreme. It's just a queue to keep the body moving and keep rotating, and from there it allows me to start everything kind of to the left and hit a little fade, which is what I like to do.

Q. Playing out of the conditional status, 126 to 150, I believe you finished 133 in the FedExCup, how important is a week like this for you?

PETER UIHLEIN: Yeah, I mean, this year I've only gotten into a couple events, so it's been trickier this year. There's a few events you think that category got in the year before, a few years before, but haven't this year. Yeah, anytime you're in an event is big. With this tour really, it's just about having big weekends. Once you have big weekends, everything else takes care of itself. Yeah, you have to take most of your opportunities and try to run with them.
