

VIKTOR HOVLAND (-18)

Q. To me, it looked effortless. Talk us through the round.

VIKTOR HOVLAND: Yeah, I played really well today, kind of the same round as the last two, just been playing really solid off the tee and been hitting a lot of really good iron shots into the greens. Early on in the round I didn't really make that many putts, but I did a really good job of just staying calm. Thankfully on the back nine I started making a couple putts and got me going.

Q. So the guys in the boot actually talked about that, they actually showed 1, 3 and 4, you birdied 2 and 5, potentially could have gone to 5 under through five. At 22 years old, how were you able to stay composed?

VIKTOR HOVLAND: I've failed a lot at it. Me and Shay were kind of talking about it the last couple weeks. I haven't been playing as good as I was this week, but I just put a lot of pressure on myself. Whenever I missed a putt, I let it really get to me. But this week, you know, I know I'm playing good, so a couple misses here and there aren't really going to kill me.

Q. So you are listed in that trio of phenoms, Matthew Wolff, Collin Morikawa. They have both won. What will it take for you to join them winning on the PGA TOUR tomorrow?

VIKTOR HOVLAND: Hopefully I just continue doing what I have been doing the first three days here. It would be unbelievable to have won on the Tour already, but I'm just worried about tomorrow. Hopefully I can hit some good shots and make some putts.

Q. Sixty-eight, 66, 64, going into tomorrow being at the top of the leaderboard, how do you feel? Emotions right now heading to tomorrow in the final pairing on Sunday?

VIKTOR HOVLAND: Yeah, I was pretty locked in on the course, I haven't really had time to think about that situation that much. I mean, it's a very uncharted territory for me. Yeah, I'm just trying to have some fun tomorrow and see how it goes.

Q. All the fans in Puerto Rico rooting for you, they love you here, they welcome you here. A victory tomorrow, what would it mean for you in your professional career having not only a victory but heading toward the rest of the year, which starting in your golf game, which you mentioned, you're starting to get a rhythm through the year?

VIKTOR HOVLAND: Yeah, it would mean a lot. It would put me in a way different position compared to what I am now. I've gotten invitations here and there, which has been great, but I would like to play my way into tournaments. Yeah, that's a very good steppingstone.
