

**KEVIN KISNER (-18)**

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**Q. Kevin, great final round. How would you assess your play out there today?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** Yeah, I got it going on the front. Just didn't birdie the par 5s on the back nine, which is a little disappointing. I knew with Bryson having the lead, I was going to have to birdie both of them, if not eagle one of them, to have a chance. Just didn't drive it in the fairway on 17. I hit two great shots on 14, just hit it in a spot that was dead and got it to 12 feet and I didn't make it. Overall, I was pleased with the whole game. Starting to see some good strides and taking me a little while to get back into the swing of things.

**Q. Did you see the fruits of kind of your labor with JT early in the week as your week went along?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** For sure. I still wasn't super comfortable on the tee balls; I was missing it left, which I normally miss it to the right. Got the putter going, which was huge for me. If you drive it 280 in the fairway, you've still got to make every putt out here anymore. So finally got the putter rolling and hit some nice putts coming in.

**Q. You played the first four weeks here, you're going to take a week off before the Memorial. Are you pleased with your play through the first four weeks, things that could be better, could be worse obviously?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** I think the level of play on Tour in these first four weeks has been incredible, cuts at 4 and 5 under every week. One bad hole on Thursday and Friday, it's tough to make the cut. overall, I'm pleased with where I've been. I'm improving and looking forward to the rest of the FedExCup season.

**Q. Obviously Bryson in the lead right now, he's been the talk of the Tour for the last four weeks. What do you make of kind of the Bryson phenomenon that's kind of created out here that he's done with the length and the bulking up?**

**KEVIN KISNER:** Well, obviously he understands what is the key to gaining the biggest advantage and that's distance, and mega distance. Like I told Amanda, he just has too much time on his hands. He needs to start getting married and having kids and feel like the rest of us.
