TONY FINAU: I had some great looks down the stretch. I didn't make the putts I needed to. Nos. 12, 14, 15, I needed to get one of those I felt like kind of coming down the stretch and I wasn't able to make one of those putts. I had another look on 17, and you've got to make those putts to win the tournament and I wasn't able to do it today. But my game's in a great place with three majors right around the corner and that's pretty exciting for me.

Q. You struggled with your driver yesterday as you told me. How do you feel like that was an asset to you today?

TONY FINAU: Yeah, it was great. I hit enough fairways to score out there. I was looking to hit the 18th green -- 18th fairway, I knew 3 was going to have an outside chance. Don't know what they're doing out there right now, but looked like 17 might have an outside chance. I was looking at the fairway there, unfortunately wasn't able to -- the driver's performed the way it needed to today, just sometimes those putts go in and sometimes they don't. Hit a lot of good ones, just didn't fall on the back nine today.

Q. How frustrating is it for you, second straight week to have a great chance and to leave empty handed?

TONY FINAU: Yeah, I think there's a little bit of frustration, but not, you know, not a lot. I hadn't posted a top-10 before last week since I lost the tough one in Phoenix. So coming off of quarantine, you never know where your game's going to be. It took me a few weeks to just emotionally be competitive and these last couple weeks have proved that I am. Like I said, with these major championships right around the corner, I'm really happy with where my game's at.

Q. You're smiling on the outside. Is it the same inside?

TONY FINAU: Mostly. You know, they don't give out second-place trophies, third-place trophies, I've learned that the hard way with lot of them coming early in my career, but I continue to just believe and hope for the best for my future.

Q. Boyd was a one-week journey out here toting the bag around for you. What decision have you made for a caddie for next week in Memphis?

TONY FINAU: I actually haven't made one yet. He won't be on the bag. I think I'll go with somebody I'm comfortable with for the next couple weeks and maybe try somebody starting the Playoffs, but somebody close to me. I'll have my brother out the next couple weeks and I'll make a decision after the PGA.
