

**DAVIS LOVE III (-4)**

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**Q. Davis, how would you assess your round?**

**DAVIS LOVE III:** Well, I'm hitting it better and better, just not quite getting enough out of it. A couple three-putts. Played pretty well and happy to be under par and done for the afternoon.

**Q. Davis, I have a couple other questions here. It's been five months since the fire. Is life getting back to normal? Is it still something you and your family are coping with day to day?**

**DAVIS LOVE III:** Day to day. Unfortunately, my wife and I both get asked questions that remind you, and people don't know what they're doing. They say, is that a new purse, and my wife says, yeah, everything I've got's new. Somebody asked me about where my old irons were. I said, well, I had to get new ones. It's always a constant reminder, but we're dealing with it. We're blessed, we're moving on, kind of back to normal. I'm out here playing and settling in.

**Q. Greensboro's obviously been good to you over the years. How does this week help in the transition from broadcasting back to resuming your full-time playing?**

**DAVIS LOVE III:** Well, jumping back in at the PGA was tough. Obviously a very tough golf course, so that was hard. This is comfortable. Greensboro's always been good to me and the golf course suits my game right now. Long and hard Harding Park didn't quite suit a guy who hasn't been playing a whole lot lately. So excited to be back here, and I always love playing Donald Ross courses and playing on bermudagrass.

**Q. What's your schedule going to look like after this?**

**DAVIS LOVE III:** I'm going to play one of the two for sure Champions Tour events in Branson. Play the Crenshaw course, for sure, then kind of assess after that. It's the start of a new season on the regular tour and a lot of great tournaments on the Champions Tour. I'll play the PURE at Pebble for sure, but I don't know about Napa or Stanford.

Stricker and I, and Furyk, we've had a lot of talks about that lately, like which way should we be going. A day like today when I hit the ball pretty good, if I don't three-putt a couple times, missed a couple short ones, other than that, if I putt decent, I'm probably 6 or 8 under par and I'm right in it. I'm leaning, I'm teetering on the fence right now which way to go.
