FINAL ROUND INTERVIEW August 2, 2020

BRETT QUIGLEY (-12)



THE MODERATOR: All right, Brett. Tough way to finish, but you battled head to head with Jim Furyk on the back nine and you still played well. What are your takeaways for the week?

BRETT QUIGLEY: Yeah. Overall, fantastic. I mean, start of the week, give me a chance to win on the last few holes, absolutely. That we started golf again, awesome. I mean, there's so many great things certainly to take from this, despite the fact finishing bogey, bogey.

THE MODERATOR: All right. Open it up to questions.

Q. You were just cruising along, too, in that final round, and then --

BRETT QUIGLEY: Yeah, I felt great. I hit a bad shot on 10, made a silly bogey, and then -- by the way, give the crew, everybody on the grounds crew credit. That golf course is fantastic, that we didn't -- we really didn't have much water. A few holes we had some, but not much, for all the rain that they had.

And then I just got a little sloppy as I was going along and unfortunately didn't do it when I had a chance.

Q. Tell us about 16. You get that birdie to fall. And you had to be feeling just great right after that. Pick it up from there.

BRETT QUIGLEY: Yeah, make the birdie there and tied -- tied it up and hit it just under the hole on 17th hole a little and just didn't hit the putt hard enough. The greens were just a little bit slower than what -- because they were so perfect the first few days. I think with the rain, and I just didn't hit a great putt on the first one, missed the second one. And then just after Furyk hits it in close on 18, all the wind was out of the sail.

Q. What's that do to your psyche after you missed that putt on 17, then you're heading to --

BRETT QUIGLEY: You want to cry and go home. Come on now. Hey, I have missed shorter putts. It's no big deal. I got up and smashed the drive on 18 and hit a great shot. So still had a chance. And again, after seeing Jim hit it in close, knew it was probably over.

But yeah, I mean, it happens. And unfortunately it will probably happen again in my

lifetime, and you just go on.

Q. All right. How about the -- real quickly, you mentioned a little bit about the course here today. How did it play with the weather?

BRETT QUIGLEY: It played a lot longer, a lot more of a challenge today. The golf course was so good the first two days, it was just incredible. And everybody should be proud here, because they did a great job leading up to it and then today getting it ready. That we even played was a minor miracle.
