Q. Patton, what a great day for you on the greens. You lead the field in putting, 138 feet in putts. Did it feel like that out there?

PATTON KIZZIRE: Yeah, it was a great start. It was tough out there. I really tried to stay patient. I bogeyed the first hole, so that wasn't ideal, but I hung in there and started making some really good putts. I think I made 138 feet of putts, they said. Anytime you can do that, your score better be pretty low.

Q. Patton, I'm doing a story on offseasons and how they might look different this year because the schedule's been crazy. Is yours going to be any different? Will the routine change at all once you're finished with everything?
