

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW

HARRIS ENGLISH (-10)

Q. Harris, so many good shots in that round, but tell me about your approach into 8. Really tough to take on that flagstick at the par 5. You fit it off that hill just perfectly.

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah, I mean, people think I live here, I play this course all the time. I've never really seen the pin there except for the tournament last year. It's probably one of the toughest pins on the hole and it's a really tough green. Feel like I had a pretty good number, I had 213 to carry the edge of the water, a little downwind off the left, so I knew if I hit it solid, I could carry it no problem. Really just hit it right where I wanted to and fed it off the hill. Left myself probably six, seven feet and hit a really good putt and barely lipped it out, but pretty easy birdie on the hole. It was awesome.

Q. I really admire the patience in the round, too, because you weren't pouring in birdies on your first few holes and yet you were able to maintain the patience, you didn't force anything in there and then you finished the round so strong.

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah, with this wind, I mean, normally Plantation plays easier, but with this wind it's still pretty tough and you have some tough shots out there. Like you said, you've got to get in the round and make some good pars on the first few holes and kind of let it happen. Got in a good rhythm birdieing 17, 18 and 1 to kind of kickstart the round and just kind of kept it in gear.

Q. Certainly revitalized your career last season, now it's time to finish it off and get the win. What will you be looking for this weekend?

HARRIS ENGLISH: Yeah, I mean, home golf course, kind of sucks we don't have fans out here because I feel like I'd have a lot of family and friends following, but it would be very special to get a win here. Feel like my game's in the right spot, hitting it really well and get a couple more putts to fall and be right there.
