



KYLE STANLEY (-10)

Q. Kyle, let's talk about today. A 65, pretty good playing out there. The iron play I thought was exceptional. You had to be really happy with that.

KYLE STANLEY: Yeah, I hit it pretty well this week, been putting it well, too. These greens are about as good as we're going to see all year. I mean, you hit good putts with good speed, they're probably going to go in.

Added length to my driver, so hitting it a little bit farther. So 15, 20 extra yards off the tee kind of makes a big deal, leaving myself some shorter irons into some of these holes, and par 5s today were pretty accessible. So yeah, really clean round, pretty happy with it.

Q. You know, when you add length, sometimes it's tough to dial it in for accuracy, but you were very accurate today so somehow you got that good combination, right?

KYLE STANLEY: Yeah, I mean, it actually feels maybe a little bit more stable than my 45-inch driver. We just added an inch. Yeah, I mean, on the range Tuesday and Wednesday getting 14, 15 extra yards a carry. On the golf course it might even be a little bit more than that, so that's been really nice. I really haven't been hitting it very far the last couple years.

Q. Talk about strategy now at Seaside. You're done with Plantation. Of course, you played there yesterday. A golf course you can be aggressive on, or how do you play? What's the strategy at Seaside?

KYLE STANLEY: Well, it kind of depends on the wind. If the wind lays down, you can go fairly low out there. It's not too particularly long. If the wind's down, you're going to have a lot of wedges into holes, stuff like that. If it gets windy, that's kind of (inaudible), you have to control your golf ball. Some of the -- up here the holes can get a little bit tight off the tee, so yeah, just hitting fairways out there and greens is -- I know it sounds kind of boring, but that's kind of key to playing well out there.

Q. You're used to the conditions, you know it's going to be windy at Seaside; it always is, right?

KYLE STANLEY: Yeah. I mean I think over the years we may have one or two calm days out there, but for the most part, yeah, you can expect to have, I would say, 10 to 20 pretty regularly.
